...Was quite an eventful one and we had a lot of decisions to make, especially with the postponement of Gay Games Hong Kong from November 2022 to November 2023. More details are below and on the latest 'Coffee with GGHK' webinar.

We've also been busy organizing our first face-to-face Annual General Assembly in two years!

Because of current COVID restrictions, we have decided to move the AGA from Hong Kong to Brighton, UK. It will begin at 9:00 AM on Monday 8 November 2021 and take place at Brighton Mercure Seafront Hotel, 149 Kings Road, Brighton, BN1 2PP, United Kingdom.

Meetings will last until 5:00 PM Friday 12 November 2021.

We also understand that some members of the General Assembly will be unable to travel due to COVID restrictions in their home countries. We will therefore continue to offer virtual participation.
