Guadalajara ready for the Gay Games

The Gay Games Guadalajara will officially close registrations on **October 8**, 2023. Make sure you register your interest with your chosen sport(s) before then to take part.

As we put the finishing touches to an **incredible lineup of competitions** covering over 20 sports, we are also excited to announce one special development from our Mexican host city.

Villa Paraísa, situated in the trendy Colonia Americana neighbourhood, will become a focal meeting point of the Games, with a wide range of social and cultural activities, including art exhibitions, musical performances, workshops and other leisure and recreational activities.

It will also be a space to provide tourist information and information about the Games themselves to visitors, as well as the place where the **official parties** will take place (some of which will be free access for people who have paid for their general registration).









The **commemorative medal** for the 11th edition of the Gay Games Guadalajara 2023 was designed by the Guadalajaran artist Ricardo Luévanos.

Luévanos took inspiration from the act of **flying from our nest to form new families.** It is these new families that will embrace us, and in whom we will find inspiration and where we can show the best of ourselves and achieve our goals.

The analogy of showing hummingbirds is because they are birds that can be seen as delicate, whilst at the same time they **strongly defend their space** and what is theirs.

"It doesn't matter if you feel small, you can become the biggest.", says Luévanos.




Stonewall Performance's retrospective of Gay Games
