Site Selection for Gay Games XII in 2026 Starting in January 2020.

Would your city like to bid for the 2026 Gay Games? Your chance to bring the largest sporting event open to all is coming very soon! The Request for Information (RFI) document will be available on January 31, 2020 with a response for intending bidders due back by February 21, 2020. The RFI document reviews the Gay Games at a very high level and provides the timeline for the site selection process. The response form that you will also receive which will be returned to the Federation of Gay Games (FGG) provides us insight into your organization, your community, and an understanding of why you would like to bring the Gay Games to your city.

Sin City Classic 2020

The Greater Los Angeles Softball Association, (GLASA) hit the jackpot in 2008 with the inception of the Sin City Classic. It started off with a strong foundation created by softball teams that came together and has grown to be the largest annual LGBTQ, multiple sport's event that occurs every January as we observe Martin Luther King Jr holiday.

Over 25 different sports are offered that range from swimming, basketball, tennis and ultimate frisbee but also includes softball, cornhole, cheerleading and more. This four day tournament attracts participants and spectators from all over the world that come together to participate and support Sin City Classic for the past 11 years. The abilities range from novice to expert and I have witnessed this for the past 3 years by attending numerous sports offered.



What is your name and what is your role at Gay Games 11 Hong Kong 2022?

My name is Sabrina Yang Wen. I am the co-chair and director of sports for Gay Games 11 Hong Kong 2022.

Tell us more about your life in Hong Kong: what do you do in daily life, which sports do you do?

I am managing a Hong Kong based food tech company called Spoonful, a virtual cafeteria group that specializes in food production and delivery service. I live with my wife Jacqueline, who is a history tutor and gym instructor. We got married in Guam last year over Easter and we have a three-year old cat named Kafka.

What excites you about Hong Kong?

What excites me the most about Hong Kong is its beautiful and diverse offering of people and scenery. You can work in the busiest financial district during the day and at night take a boat home to a remote island and grow your own vegetables. You feel free and safe like nowhere else and everyone you meet is open and well-travelled, and therefore

How did you learn about the gay games?

I first learned about the Gay Games from a fundraising event in 2016 where the team was trying to bid to host the Games in 2022.

Why did you join Gay Games 11 Hong Kong 2022 team?

I still remember the first time I went to an LGBTQ+ event six years ago and how scared I was to introduce myself because I had always been very closeted at work and in life. People welcomed me with warm hearts and hugs and helped me accept who I really am. Ever since I have always wanted to give back to the community, so I organized weekly lesbian sports events, social gatherings and started to be more vocal on social media about LGBTQ+ rights. I believe in the power of sports and community. Gay Games is the perfect platform to bring people together and I know it's time for me to contribute to an event that's bigger than myself.

Even though I have not been to the Gay Games before, I have heard from past participants how inspiring it is and I am in a wechat group of participants from the Greater China region (Mainland China, Hong Kong and Taiwan), where people talk about their memories of the Paris Games almost every day and about how excited they are for the 2022 Games. Then I know I will impact more people's lives than I can imagine. I am already myself inspired everyday working with the Gay Games 11 Hong Kong team and the FGG, speaking to sports leads from all over the world dedicating their free time to build and grow the LGBT sports scene in their home countries. I know from now to 2022 and beyond, more people from Hong Kong, Mainland China, and across Asia will be united because of what we are doing out of the spirit of sport and love.

International Front Runners Chooses New President

FGG member organization International Front Runners (IFR) is proud to announce the election of its new President Chris Rauchle, a member of Sydney Frontrunners and the long-time IFR Australia, Asia Pacific Regional Representative.

Chris takes over from Danny Luong, who represented IFR at the Paris Gay Games and fostered a landmark partnership with Brooks Running. Danny will continue to oversee the Brooks / IFR scholarship program and we thank him for his service as president of IFR and his continuing involvement. Of note is that Chris is the first President of IFR from outside the United States, which highlights that the fast-growing family of 113 LGBTQ+ running clubs on 5 continents is now comprised of a majority of non-U.S. clubs.

Chris Rauchle is a 52 year old IT Project Manager originally from Queensland he has been living in Sydney, New South Wales for 30 years.

He has been running seriously for 15 years. Taking it up as part of triathlon, he found that with the right shoes and enough spare time he could run very much farther than his original distance of 400 meters around his local park. Working his way up from 5k to the half marathon in a series of races in Sydney he eventually took on his first marathon and now enjoys running this distance although he will never win any races. As a side effect of diet and exercise (go figure!) he lost 20kgs (40lb) after taking up running regularly in 2004 and enjoys the time running alone, with the Sydney Frontrunners, or with his "Red Dog" Kelpie, Jessie, in the outdoors when running around his local park, Centennial Park. This is the park the Sydney Frontrunners use for their regular runs.

Having been involved with the Sydney LGBTQI+ community for 30 years (almost as long as Sydney Frontrunners has been around) Chris has been the Sydney Frontrunners webmaster and been on the Sydney Frontrunners committee in various roles. He has project-managed the charity Little Black Dress Run for five years which has raised up to \$54,000 annually for children living with HIV+ and Youth programs. He has been the Asia/Pacific representative for International Frontrunners for four years.

Chris is interested in growing the organisation in Asia, South America, and Africa. He has visited the cities with Frontrunners clubs in Australia, New Zealand and Japan several times over the last few years for work and pleasure. Not wanting to wait for the legalisation of same-sex marriage in Australia, he and his now husband, John, were married in Wellington, New Zealand in 2015, another city with a vibrant Frontrunners club.

When the opportunity to be the first President outside of North America presented itself, he leapt at the chance to show the truly global nature of our community of LGTBQI+ runners where it is possible to share good fellowship and exercise in more than one hundred cities around the world.

AIDS MEMORIAL QUILT RETURNS TO SAN FRANCISCO BAY AREA





AIDS Memorial Quilt Exhibition Gay Games 10: Paris 2018

On 20 November 2019, Speaker of the House of Representatives Nancy Pelosi and other Congressional leaders joined the NAMES Project Foundation (NPF) in announcing that the National AIDS Memorial will be the new caretaker of the AIDS Memorial Quilt ("The Quilt"), returning from Atlanta to its home in the San Francisco Bay Area.

The Quilt, founded in San Francisco by Cleve Jones in 1987, and its programs, which include display activities, panel making, conservation, and public education efforts, will transition to the National AIDS Memorial in early 2020. It will thus become an integral part of its mission to provide, in perpetuity, a place of remembrance so that the lives of people who died from AIDS are not forgotten and that their stories are known and understood by future generations. This archival collection currently totals more than 200,000 items. It includes biographical records, correspondence, photographs, tributes, epitaphs, news clippings and artifacts submitted by panel makers that add context about the lives memorialized on The Quilt panels.

On behalf of the Federation of Gay Games Culture and Ceremonies Committee, we thank The NAMES Project Foundation for caring for The Quilt. We are deeply grateful to have had The Quilt as a Visual Arts core component in our Cultural Festival. We look forward to our next exhibition at Gay Games 11 in Hong Kong in November, 2022. In 2018, Gert McMullin, one of the founders of the Quilt, offered the following description of the Quilt when she received the FGG's Tom Waddell Award during Gay Games 10 in Paris: "The AIDS Quilt is the world's largest community art project."
